## **LEADERSHIP LESSON 38: OVERCOMING SUNDAY SCHOOL MYTHS**

## **OUTLINE BY DWIGHT MOSS**

Myth number 1: "A large class is the sign of a great teacher."

- A large class breeds *anonymity*.
- It's harder for a new person to become <u>assimilated</u> into a large class.
- The true sign of a great teacher is how many people are <u>equipped</u> for ministry and sent into <u>service</u>.

Myth number 2: "It doesn't matter if we start the class on time or not."

- It is a <u>systemic</u> problem throughout the Sunday School.
- We are being dishonest to *guests*.
- It minimizes the importance of *class time*.

*Myth number 3: "Sunday morning Bible study is the main thing in Sunday School."* 

- **Evangelism** and **discipleship** are the primary reasons for Sunday School.
- Bible study is one *tool* we use to accomplish these goals.
- People are not as interested in how much we **know** as how much we **care**.

Myth number 4: "New members should not be enrolled until having visited three consecutive Sundays."

- Everyone who attends Sunday School attends for a <u>reason</u>.
- Enrollment creates a *connection*.
- Enrollment creates *accountability*.

Myth number 5: "Members who have not attended in the past year should be removed from the roll."

- It should be a "ministry list" not a class roll.
- Lack of attendance is an indication of another *problem*.
- Inactives are your best <u>prospects</u>.

Myth number 6: "The pastor's role in Sunday School is not important."

- The pastor is the most *important* person in Sunday School.
- The pastor's most important jobs in Sunday School are <u>promotion</u> and <u>encouragement</u>.
- The pastor can exhibit *ministry*.

*Myth number 7: "Lecture is the best teaching method for all adults."* 

- Lecture takes the least *preparation* than other teaching methods.
- People best learn from a *variety* of teaching styles.
- It is best to not get *stuck* on any one teaching style. Use a variety of styles

*Myth number 8: "I've been teaching for 20 years. I don't need training."* 

- Longevity does not equal *quality*.
- Teachers who receive training encourage the other class leaders to <u>improve</u> themselves.
- All Sunday School *positions* need refresher training.

Myth number 9: "Younger preschoolers can't be taught. They just need babysitting."

- Preschool teachers can express God's <u>love</u>.
- Preschoolers learn <u>comfort</u> and <u>trust</u> in Sunday School
- Preschool learning serves as the *foundation* for later learning.

Myth number 10: "There is no need to hold Sunday School leaders accountable for their responsibilities."

- All people want to do a <u>good</u> job in their positions.
- People expect accountability according to the *importance* of their position.
- **Job descriptions** and **evaluations** can keep workers accountable.

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
