<u>LEADERSHIP LESSON 42:</u> PLUGGING THE LEAKS – HOW TO RECLAIM ABSENTEES OUTLINE BY JOHN JOHNSTON

- 1. Read Matthew 25: 42-45
- 2. Jesus commands us to reach out to people with a variety of needs. People who become chronic absentees miss Sunday School for a <u>variety of reasons</u>: illness, embarrassment over a financial set-back or <u>iob loss</u>, lacking a sense of <u>belonging</u>, and, unfortunately, <u>sin</u> in their lives. In each instance, this passage of scripture admonishes us to go to those people and meet them at their <u>point of need</u>.
- 3. How can Sunday School leaders effectively reclaim absentees?
 - By visiting absentees to determine if there is a problem or a need.
 - By **enlisting** class members to help meet any **physical needs** of absentees.
 - By <u>encouraging</u> absentees to remain faithful to the Lord, and being a <u>friend</u> in times of need.
 - By **praying** for and with absentees.
 - By **helping** absentees who are struggling with sin or other spiritual issues.
 - By **inviting** them to class fellowships and other activities in addition to Bible study.
 - By <u>relying</u> on God. Don't be quick to drop an absentee from your roll! God may be working in ways we cannot see.
- 4. It may be a cliché, but the saying is true: People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care!
- 5. How do we avoid the problem of chronic absenteeism?
 - Our classes need to be **open** and **friendly.** Cliques create a climate where newcomers feel left out and they often drop out.
 - A consistent system of **record keeping** is important in keeping track of people.
 - Establish <u>care groups</u> that divide the class into groups of five or six, each with a <u>care group leader</u> who keeps in touch with his or her group and can quickly learn of any problems.
 - Provide frequent opportunities for <u>fellowship</u>. People tend to come regularly when they connect with other people.
 - Get people <u>involved</u> in the class. <u>Enlist</u> a variety of people to serve in different tasks greeters, hospitality, inreach, outreach, ministry and mission projects, etc. A title is not always required. People tend to make <u>deeper commitments</u> when they have a sense of responsibility.
 - Bear one another's **burdens**. (Galatians 6:2) Create a climate where people feel comfortable sharing needs and burdens. Spend time as a class praying for one another.
 - Avoid making <u>sarcastic and hurtful</u> remarks when absentees return, such as "Well, I see the steeple didn't fall over!" Instead, be <u>welcoming</u> and friendly when they do come back.
