A Christian Growth Study For Sunday School Leaders

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PREPARATION

Plan to seat your Sunday School leaders at tables where they can write. Provide a copy of the fill-in-the-blank guide and a pencil for each person present. Provide a gospel tract for each person to use during the session.

INTRODUCTION

You are part of an exciting journey. It is our journey through life with the Lord Jesus Christ. As a part of your journey, Christ has opened the door of opportunity for you to be a Sunday School worker for Him. God has equipped you with spiritual gifts, abilities, and life experiences to serve Him on this journey.

TEACHERS

Share a 3-minute testimony of how you began your journey with Christ. Share about when you became a Christian and something good that God has done for you on your journey with Him.

SHARING EXPERIENCE

In groups of 5 people, give each person an opportunity to share how they began their journey with Christ (when they became a Christian) and something good that God has done for them on their journey. Explain that each person will have 3 minutes to share.

This time of sharing reminds us of how good God has been to us (John 1:16). Our motivation for serving God through the Sunday School is our thankfulness, love and devotion to God. Simply, we serve God in Sunday School because He loves us and we love Him. This love continually motivates us even in times when our service demands much of us.

There is a common denominator of churches that are alive, healthy and fulfilling Christ's mission in their communities. If you were to study churches where people view what is happening and say, "Only God could do that", you would find in those churches leaders who are committed to being fully devoted to Christ and growing in their faith. You would discover a strong commitment to personal spiritual growth among leaders and an undying love for Jesus Christ.

OUR SPECIAL STUDY TODAY IS -BEING A PERSON OF <u>GRACE</u>

The Bible commands us.... "But grow in <u>GRACE</u>, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." (II Peter 3:18) (KJV)

Each letter in the word "GRACE" in our study today represents an important part of our being fully devoted to Christ as Christians and Sunday School leaders.

These five elements of GRACE are a picture from the New Testament of what it means to be a fully devoted follower of Christ (worshipping God – sharing our faith – applying God's word through Bible study – caring for other believers and ministering in our church and world). God calls us as His followers to practice these five areas in our lives. Being a person of GRACE is a key to being an effective and God-pleasing Sunday School leader.

Being a Person of Grace



rowing closer to God through worship.

- Fellowship with us is so important to God that Jesus <u>DIED</u> on the cross so that we might have the most intimate fellowship with Him.
- <u>JESUS</u> himself gives us a great example. He spent time alone with the father. Jesus received strength from his time with the father to do His will.
- Every Sunday School leader should be faithful in worshipping God at church worship services. God is <u>WORTHY</u> of our worship. He is to be praised. Our worship delights God. His presence should fill us with joy. Worship is a key to being a healthy and happy Christian and Sunday School leader. God answers our prayers in worship. As God's word is proclaimed in worship, we receive direction for living. Most of all, God deserves our worship.

As a Sunday School leader we also set an example to others by our presence in worship. There may be a time that we can't be in worship because of our jobs or other circumstances. We should be consistent in worship.

Hebrews 10:24-25

God desires that we have a lifestyle of worship. This involves worshipping Him in a <u>QUIET TIME</u> or time alone with Him each day. This is a special time set aside for God each day to grow closer to Him. This can be a brief period of time or a long period of time. As I spend time with Christ, I grow to love Him more.

It is important to decide on a specific <u>TIME</u> and <u>PLACE</u> where you will not be disturbed. <u>MORNINGS</u> are a good time to have a quiet time. Our minds are usually more rested.

WHAT TO DO IN YOUR QUIET TIME

As we read the scriptures, God <u>SPEAKS TO US</u> from His word. As we pray we <u>SPEAK</u> <u>TO GOD</u>.


There may be a day when you miss your quiet time. Don't give up. Our prayer and quiet time is the key to growing in our love for God and being effective for Him.

- 1. <u>PRAISE</u> God for who He is and what He has done. Thank Him for blessings.
- 2. Commit yourself to GOD'S WILL.
- 3. Ask God to supply your <u>NEEDS</u>. (Phil. 4:19)
- 4. Ask God to <u>FORGIVE</u> your sins. (A time to forgive others)
- 5. Pray for other <u>PEOPLE</u>.

When we worship God together in our quiet time He feels our love. He loves us and answers our prayers.

ACTIVITY

You may want to enlist someone to share a 2-minute testimony about what their quiet time has meant to them, or ask if anyone in the group would like to share.



Every Sunday School class is a MISSION POINT to reach people for Christ. (Acts 1:8)

WAYS TO REACH OUR MISSION FIELD

- Share your <u>TESTIMONY</u> with others. People enjoy hearing what has happened to other people. Share briefly your life before Christ, how you trusted Christ as Lord and Savior, and what God has done for you since then.
- Be <u>EQUIPPED</u> to clearly share the gospel. Provide a tract such as "The Four Spiritual Laws" and review with the class how to use this tool.
- <u>ENROLL</u> people in Sunday School. Thousands of people have become Christians after enrolling in Sunday School. Enroll ANYONE, ANYTIME, ANYWHERE if they agree. You don't have to be a member of the church to enroll in Sunday School. You can enroll people even before they attend and begin to minister to them.
- Develop <u>FRIENDSHIPS</u> with unchurched people and witness to them.
- <u>RELATIONSHIPS</u> Reach out to family, friends, work associates, neighbors and others.
- Participate in the church's <u>OUTREACH</u>.

pply God's word for spiritual growth.

reating an atmosphere of caring and fellowship. (Galatians 6:10; Hebrews 10:24)

Jesus prayed a wonderful prayer for all believers (John 17:20-21).

Through the Sunday School, God gives us many opportunities to care, fellowship and minister to one another. We can...

- <u>ENCOURAGE</u> one another.
- Hold each other <u>ACCOUNTABLE</u> to grow and live a moral life.
- <u>PRAY</u> together.
- <u>WITNESS</u> to the world by the testimony of our love for one another.
- <u>MINISTER</u> together using our spiritual gifts and abilities.
- <u>BEAR</u> each others' burdens.
- <u>TEACH</u> each other spiritual truths.
- <u>SERVE</u> each other.
- <u>FORGIVE</u> each other.
- <u>CARE</u> for those who don't attend.

There are times when people are removed from the Sunday School roll simply because they do not attend. We need to see these names on our Sunday School rolls as faces of people who need our care and ministry. No one should be dropped from the Sunday School rolls because they are not attending. They are people to pray for and care about, even if they don't attend.

xperiencing a lifestyle of ministry.

Through our service in the Sunday School we have an opportunity to use our <u>SPIRITUAL</u> <u>GIFTS, PASSION FOR CERTAIN MINISTRIES, ABILITIES, UNIQUE</u> <u>PERSONALITY</u>, as well as past experiences and <u>EXPERTISE</u>. It is God's plan for our lives to be more fulfilled as we serve Him. Serving God in our church, Sunday School and in the world is important to Him.

We also serve God through the use of our financial resources (Malachi 3:10). A tithe is giving 10% of our income. An offering is anything we give in <u>ADDITION</u> to our tithe.

As we keep our commitments to God, He will bless us and give us satisfaction.
