## MAKING GOD'S WORD A PRIORITY IN CHILDREN'S LIVES

Jesus tells us in Mark 13:31:

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will never pass away."

Today we focus on material items and earthly recognition instead of what Jesus tells us is the only thing that will last forever-His words! How can we make learning and following God's Word a priority in the lives of the children in our church?

- 1. Provide every child a <u>Bible</u> that attends or is a member of your church. As children enter first grade and are learning to read it is a wonderful idea for the church to recognize them by presenting them with a Bible so they can read the most important book in the world.
- 2. Remember children of all <u>ages</u> can learn God's word. You can begin with simple concepts about the Bible such as: the Bible is a special book and continue to teach concepts such as how to find books of the Bible, learn verses, and how to use it as children mature.
- 3. We all learn by example, so allow the children to see you <u>use</u> your Bible as you teach them and when you are in worship services.
- 4. Allow children to <u>learn by doing.</u> Let them use their Bibles every time they are at church. They can look up books of the Bible and look up specific Scripture that go along with every lesson.
- 5. Encourage **<u>parents</u>** to read God's word to their children, and show children through example the importance of having a daily quiet time.
- Provide <u>church programs</u> such as Bible Drill that focus primarily on how to use and navigate through the Bible. Also, reinforce Bible skills in all weekly church programs, such as Sunday School, Mission and Discipleship programs.

We want our children to treasure God's word in their hearts and have it readily available for them at times of need and to help them as they make decisions.
