Building Blocks for Childhood Discipleship

"Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not depart from it."

Proverbs 22:6 (KJV)

What is the goal of childhood discipleship?

To lay a foundation in children's lives so they will have a biblical worldview, will learn how to have a relationship with Jesus Christ, will gain Bible knowledge and Bible skills and will learn to serve.

1. **Biblical Worldview**

Paul says to Timothy,

"But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing those from whom you learned, and that from **childhood** you have known the sacred Scriptures, which are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus." 2 Timothy 3:14-15 (HCSB)

How can we effectively help children know the scripture?

- 2. Relationship with Christ: When a child comes to understand that he is a sinner, he also needs to realize that there is a Savior. Children must comprehend that his personal sin separates him from a relationship with God. Using Leading a Child to Christ Training Pack (with DVD) will help you feel equipped to share the gospel with children. Disciple children who have made a profession of faith with I'm a Christian Now! This resource helps leaders conduct a four-week new Christian class for children in grades 1–6.
- 3. Children need to learn to use their Bible and gain Bible skills. A great resource to use to help children learn Bible Skills is <u>Bible Skills</u>, <u>Drills & Thrills</u>. It contains fun lessons with skill building activities that will help children as they learn to use their Bibles.
- 4. Children need to learn to <u>Serve</u>. There is not a better way to apply the Bible's teaching than to serve others. Both preschool and children's <u>TeamKID</u> curriculum includes a segment called <u>Reach Out</u>. It helps children become aware of missionaries. Plus, it helps them to pray for and serve others both in their own communities and on the other side of the world. <u>Schedule</u> regular service projects your children can participate in.
